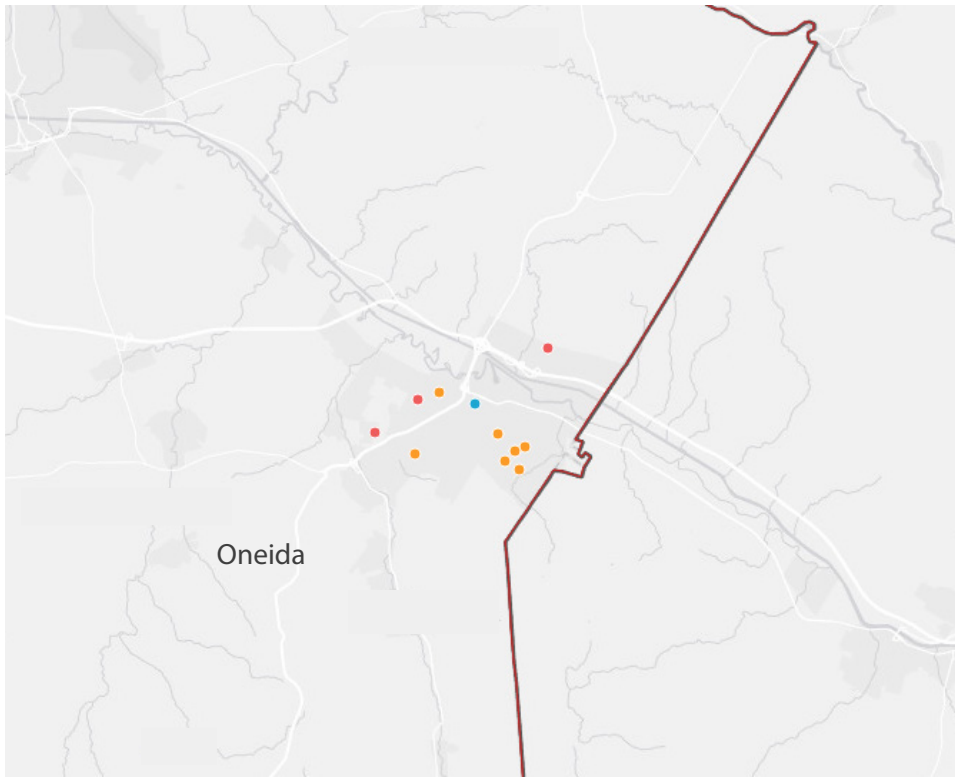


The Afterschool Landscape in ONEIDA COUNTY
