\$35 Million Empire State After-School Program Funds Awarded

Albany NY – Governor Cuomo and the Office of Child and Family Services (OCFS) announced today the school districts that will be receiving funds from the \$35 million EmpireState After-School program. The program which was approved in the 2018 budget will provide additional afterschool spots for some 22,000 students across New York State.

"The Empire State After-School program is a historic investment in the youth and families of New York State," said Kelly Sturgis, Executive Director of the New York State Network for Youth Success. "Thanks to Governor Cuomo, 22,000 additional students will have the opportunity to participate in an afterschool or summer program. These programs have real and lasting positive impacts on the lives of youth and their families. We look forward to continue working with the Governor and the Legislature to expand this program over the coming years so every child who wants a program has access to one."

In addition to adding 22,000 new afterschool spots for youth across New York State, the Empire State After-School program could also create over 2,000 new jobs for front line staff in the afterschool programs.
