



Additional information:

- WIA legislation defines the upper age for youth as 21.
- The level of engagement and involvement of Youth Councils and WIBs vary on the local level.
- The Local WIB must decide how to allocate funding to serve Out of School Youth and In School Youth, and how much funding to allocate to summer youth employment opportunities. This decision is based on recommendations from its Youth Council.
- WIA requires that WIBs must spend at least 30 percent of Youth Program funds on Out-of School Youth.
- Local WIBs can decide to allow youth over 18 years old to be co-enrolled in both the Youth and Adult programs on a case-by-case scenario, especially if additional services that are not available through the contractors are accessible through the One Stop.
