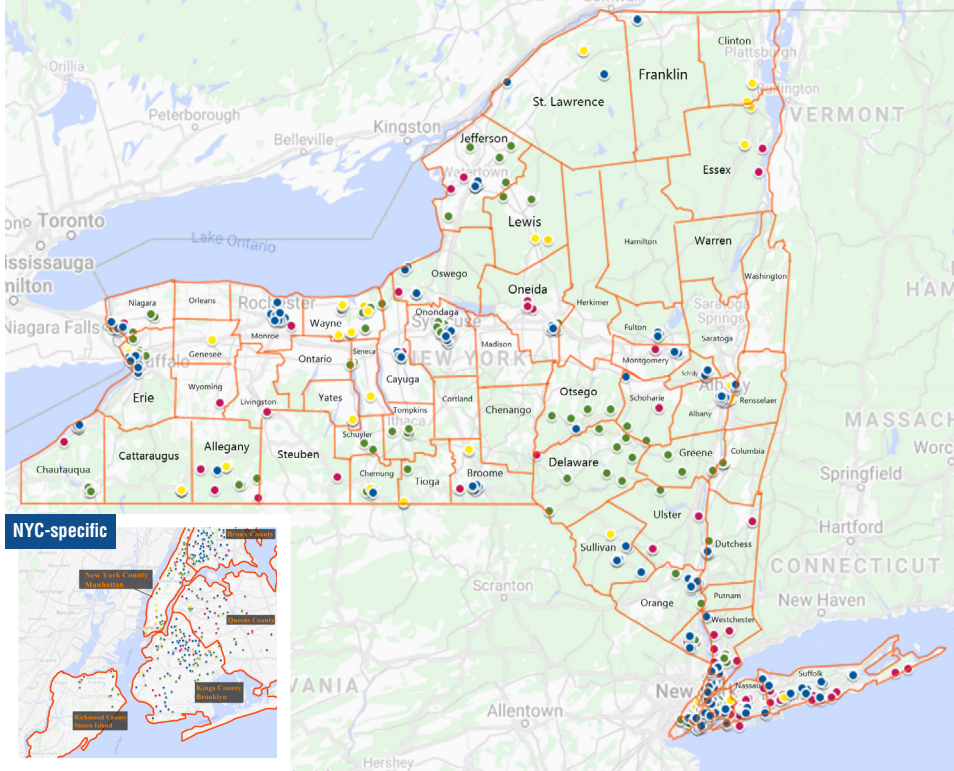


# The Afterschool Landscape in New York State

Statewide, there are **204** Advantage After School Programs, **320** Empire State After-School Programs, **370** 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers Programs, and **191** Extended School Day/School Violence Prevention Programs.

For every child in an afterschool program, **4** are waiting to get in, with **340,053** children alone and unsupervised after school.



**122,601**

New York students currently benefit from state and federally funded afterschool programs.



**1.6 million**

New York students are still in need of access to high-quality afterschool programs in New York.



**88%**

of New York parents/caregivers are in favor of funding for programs that provide afterschool opportunities.



**33%**

of children participating in afterschool in New York are from low-income households.



**82%**

of New York parents/caregivers agree that afterschool programs help children gain interest and skills in STEM.
