In November 2017, 3-year-old Elijah Silvera from New York City was given a grilled cheese sandwich while at day care despite having a known severe dairy allergy; Elijah went into anaphylaxis and died.

In 2019, New York State adopted new legislation called Elijah's Law. Elijah's Law impacts all licensed/registered child care programs and requires them to follow allergy guidelines to prevent, recognize, and respond to life-threatening anaphylactic reactions. Child care professionals play a critical role in protecting the health and safety of the children in their programs, which includes allergy awareness.

The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates allergies impact that 1 in 13 children. Allergies have the potential to create a life-threatening situation. Anaphylaxis (a severe, life-threatening allergic reaction) must be treated right away. By learning about allergies and preventing anaphylaxis, child care providers can save lives.

This guide is designed to help raise allergy awareness and to increase provider participation in the NYS Non-Patient Specific Auto-Injector Initiative through the power of social media. Please feel free to use any or all of the assets to help spread the word on your own social media channels.

Senate Appropriations Committee Releases FY 2024 Education Spending Bill

On July 27, the Senate Appropriations Committee released and marked up their Labor, Health, and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies (LHHS-ED) bill. The bill proposes \$224.2 billion in total funding for fiscal year 2024 with the 21st Century Community Learning Centers program (21st CCLC) level-funded at \$1.329 billion. The bill followed spending limits set in the Fiscal Responsibility Act, unlike the House Appropriations subcommittee, which cut \$60 billion and has not been considered by the full House Appropriations Committee.

The Senate bill would provide \$76.6 billion in discretionary funding for the Department of Education. Along with the level funding to 21st CCLC programs, the Senate bill included a \$700 million increase to the Child Care and Development Block Grant for a total of \$8.7 billion. Additionally, the Full Service Community School grant program was level-funded at the FY 2023 levels.

Accessibility in the Workplace

August 9, 11:00 am - 12:00 pm | Register Now

When an organization successfully builds a culture of inclusion, employees feel comfortable bringing their full selves to work. This interactive session will explore how to build an inclusive environment for employees including creating an accessible hiring process, staff meetings, and training. Bias Blocks: Practical Solutions for Equitable Change August 11, 10:00 am - 11:30 am | Register Now

Participants will continue to explore the effects of bias while focusing on solutions for reducing bias at the personal and institutional levels. They will be introduced to evidence-based strategies that interrupt biased thinking, reflective prompts for sustainable bias mitigation, and assessment considerations for equitable outcomes. Tools and resource lists will be provided to assist participants in developing action plans for change.

This session will present a brief overview of Trauma-Informed Care, followed by a Native perspective and teaching on child development and trauma. We will then discuss the intergenerational patterns of unhealthy behaviors such as addictions, domestic violence, and similar dynamics and provide a definition of Historical Trauma. Using examples of these traumas that have impacted Native Americans, we will discuss the consequences on community health disparities, people's mental health, degree of engagement in mainstream programs (or lack thereof), and how organizations may be able to overcome the barriers seen in many cross-cultural interactions.

This session will address Cultural Humility from a Haudenosaunee and Native American cultural perspective and discuss some of the historical and continuing factors that impact diverse communities but are often unrecognized by mainstream society. Using a Trauma-Informed Care approach, we will explore the multiple factors of historical traumas and the unresolved, continuing consequences of these challenges, referencing Native American experiences. Based on these perspectives, we will provide insights into some of the dynamics that may impact cross-cultural interactions, levels of trust and mistrust, and emerging approaches that are designed to improve the health and wellbeing of all peoples.




