New Advocacy Campaign Website: #AfterschoolRisingNY

The Network for Youth Success is pleased to announce our new, afterschool campaign, #AfterschoolRisingNY.

The last few years have accentuated the critical role of afterschool in supporting youth and families. However, the need for afterschool continues to outpace availability. For every child in afterschool in New York, 4 are waiting for an available program.

Despite high demand, state investments towards direct afterschool funding has remained stagnant. Perhaps more critically, persistent structural, financial and administrative challenges make it difficult to gain timely access to current funds available to support afterschool providers.

New York must change this.

This year, the Network is pushing to increase funding for programs and technical assistance, address barriers to accessing funds and implementing programs, and prioritize sustainability to meet the increased demand for afterschool.

We need your support to create the robust, sustainable afterschool in New York that youth, families, and communities deserve. Here are ways you can help:

Join the 2024 Million Girls Moonshot Flight Crew



The Moonshot has launched a nationwide search for the next Flight Crew. This group of youth advocates promote the value of afterschool STEM learning and equity in STEM for young people across the nation.

All girls, non-binary, or cis-gender youth (ages 13-18) with experience in afterschool and summer STEM learning are encouraged to apply. The application for the 2024 Million Girls Moonshot Flight Crew is open through December 1.

From February—September 2024, the Flight Crew will:

- Act as a champion for afterschool STEM by sharing their first-hand, impactful STEM experiences beyond the classroom.
- Work with state leaders on relevant opportunities to advocate for STEM, create social media content, and connect with media.
- Aspire to break down stereotypes and spark their peers' curiosity in STEM by connecting their STEM experiences to everyday life.
- Receive leadership development opportunities, including public speaking, social media, and connections to mentors.

Computer Science Education Week

Computer Science Education (CSEdweek) was founded in 2009 to raise awareness about the need to increase computer science education and to highlight the critical role of computing in all careers. This year's theme highlights progress in computer science education over the last decade.

We'll celebrate CSEdWeek December 4-10. Be sure to register your events at <u>csedweek.org</u> and use #CSEdWeek #CelebratingProgress for awareness.

Other computer science resources:

- **Hour of Code**—During <u>Computer Science Education Week</u>, tens of thousands of Hours of Code events will happen around the world. Any afterschool program can register as an official Hour of Code event and add their location to the global map.
- <u>Code.org's Free CS curriculum</u>—Free, flexible, and fun curriculum for every grade level (elementary, middle, and high school), includes lesson plans, videos, slides, assessments, and programming tools.
- **Hour of Code Activities**—A collection of one-hour tutorials designed for all ages in over 45 languages. Join millions of students and teachers in over 180 countries starting with an Hour of Code!
- What Are the Chances?—This activity includes an introductory video to illustrate the activity. Youth experiment with probability to tell how likely it is that an event will occur. In this activity, youth will do these calculations and then test if your calculations hold true for reality.
- Educator Guide: Make a Planetary Exploration Balloon—This activity for grades 3-12 uses math and engineering to design a balloon and gondola system capable of supporting weight. In this design challenge, students will then determine the mass needed to cause the balloon to ascend at a given rate, descend at a given rate, and/or maintain a constant altitude over a set period of time.


