

Impact of Afterschool on Early Literacy Outcomes

The NYS Network for Youth Success, as part of Education Trust– New York's **New York Campaign for Early Literacy**, hosted a webinar and released a new policy brief on how afterschool, summer, and expanded learning opportunities are an effective, often overlooked, resource to help address the literacy crisis. The brief, "**The Role of Afterschool, Summer, and Other Expanded Learning Programs in Improving Early Literacy Outcomes**," explores the role of afterschool programs in supporting early literacy outcomes, highlights high-quality programs currently working to support literacy for the youth and families in their programs, and provides recommendations for how we can support their work. The afterschool bright spots highlighted in the brief are engaging in many beneficial activities: they provide additional supports through direct programming, build capacity of organizations to promote early literacy, and leverage schoolcommunity partnerships.

On March 14, the Network for Youth Success released the brief as part of an hour-long webinar, "<u>It Takes the Village!: Exploring the Role of Expanded Learning Opportunities in Improving Early Literacy Outcomes</u>." Following an overview of the brief, panelists from organizations spotlighted in the brief shared their perspectives.

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Office of Child Care (OCC) recently announced a new rule that will lower costs for families that receive child care subsidies, improve payment practices to child care providers, and increase families' child care options. The changes make much needed updates to the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF), which is the nation's largest funding stream to help families afford child care and improve quality in child care settings. 
Earthrise: NASA's Monthly Collection of Earth and Climate Science Resources
